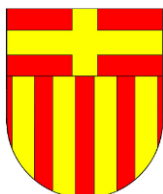

Reporting illness

If your child is unable to attend school due to illness, please report this to the school office between 0815 and 0900hrs on each day of absence. It is important to keep us informed of attendance. If we are unaware of the reasons why a child is absent, we will employ the following procedures:

1. After the school registers are completed by 0845hrs, checks are made to ensure that all absent pupils are accounted for, either by the receipt of a letter from parents or a telephone call.
2. In the case of unexplained absence, we will make a telephone call to the home, mobile and work numbers we have on our system in the attempt to ensure all children are safe.
3. If we are still unsure of the safety of any child, after numerous attempts to contact you we will contact relevant Unit Welfare Offices and request their assistance in attempting to establish the 'whereabouts' of the absent child.



Today, if your child(ren) are in Year 1-6, you will have received a letter for the launch of Seesaw from Mr Parkinson. This is an excellent resource which will allow you to see what great learning your child(ren) are achieving throughout their school day/week. It will also be used as a class communication tool by teachers. I would strongly encourage all to parents to download the Seesaw app to a home device or phone and enjoy seeing what incredible learners the children are. We are hoping to launch Seesaw for all children across FS1 and FS2 in the coming weeks, so watch this space...
