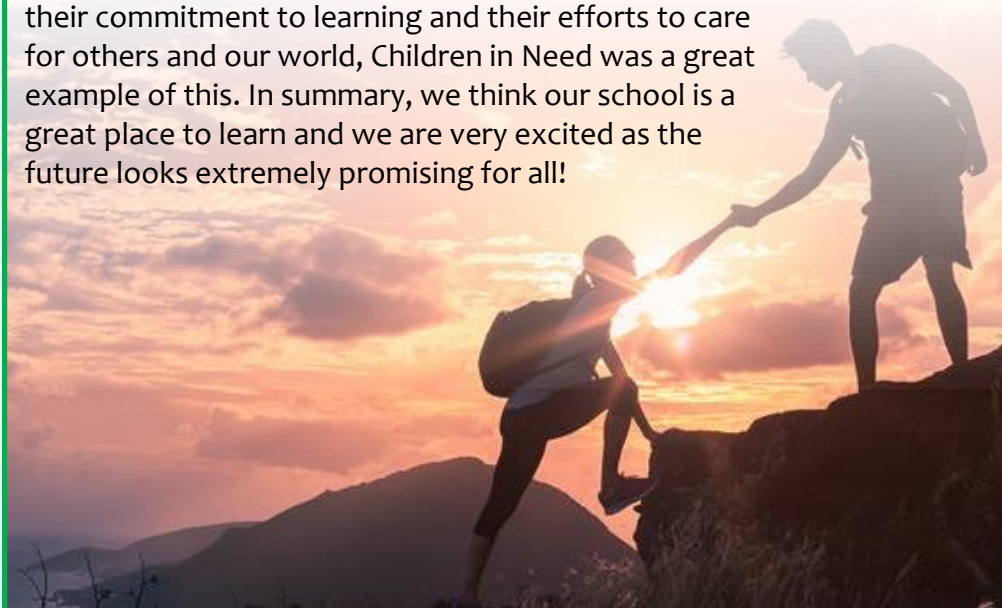


Message from Mr Chapman
