# Safeguarding information update – Staying safe with YouTube

#### Staying safe online

We know many of our children love to watch Youtube videos. Youtube is a fantastic resource and you will find many informative and entertaining videos on the platform. The app 'Youtube Kids' is a great alternative to the main website (and app) and a way that parents can ensure children are viewing age appropriate material. The app is designed to only show content that is aimed at children but each video uploaded is not checked and approved before going live. The creator of the content has the option to select whether the material is suitable to children when they are uploading and in doing so will determine whether their video makes its way onto the 'kids' specific app. Whilst YouTube do have safeguards and filtering tools to protect against harmful and inappropriate content , the videos on the platform are not given an age rating and parents could find their children are able to access videos that may not be age appropriate. Our advice would always be to check in with your children whilst they are using this platform and make yourself aware of the content they are watching.

#### AWS/Garrison update

#### Summer Activities on Normandy Barracks

Most of you will be aware that unfortunately AWS are currently unable to offer Youth & Community Summer activities which children can attend without parents being present. Within the Community Hub we will be providing activities throughout the summer period, within the limitations of Covid 19, Safeguarding and SHEF regulations.

#### Planned activities at the moment are as follows:

*Tots & Toddlers* – Every Monday at Brydon House 10am-12pm, weather permitting this will be expanded into the garden play area.

*Coffee morning* – Every Wednesday at Brydon House 10am- 12pm, this will be expanded to include limited Stay & Play activities, weather and resources permitting.

*Free Children's Matinees at the Cinelink Cinema* on Normandy Barracks, weekly throughout the school holidays. The film of the day, dates and timings will be advertised through the Social media outlets. Children must be accompanied by an adult.

Manpower permitting (reliant on the skills and strength of the QM's team) the *Bouncy Castles* will be set up adjacent to Brydon House (when the weather forecast allows us to plan ahead). Parents will be responsible for their children at all times, dates and timings will be advertised through the Social media outlets.

*Strong Bonds activities*, led by Padre Richard, based around St Boniface Church & Normandy Barracks on Wednesday 4th/Thursday 5th August and Wednesday 11th/Thursday12th August. More details to follow. The *Community Library* in Brydon House is ready for use with loads of books for adults and young people. It's an honesty library so no membership is needed, and there's no deadline on returning the books; you can just return the books to the designated returns shelf when you are ready. If there is a book you would like to keep, you are more that welcome to. We will also accept book donations (in good condition, please).

#### Any child attending the planned activities must be accompanied by an adult at all times.

If anyone has ideas that would fit within the boundaries that we have to work within, then please let us know and we will see what is within the art of the possible. Local Covid19 regulations need to be remembered and could lead to the cancelling of a planned activity at short notice.
