Community Awareness - German regulations regarding child seats

In Germany, child seat regulations apply to all children up to the age of 12 or a height of 150cm. Depending on the age, weight and height of a child, there are different types of child seats; infant carriers for newborns, next-stage child seats for toddlers and booster seats for older children. These seats are designed to optimally support the child’s body and to absorb the forces in the event of an accident in such a way that the risk of injury is minimised. Fines are issued for anyone who violates the regulation.
